FIELD EXPERIENCE

During my career in cultural resource management, I have authored or co-authored nearly 300 reports as an architectural historian, mostly in the Southeastern United States. While working on my undergraduate degree, I was awarded two internships by the University of Memphis

Department of History, Davies Manor Plantation (Spring 2001) and Pink Palace Museum of History (Spring 2002) under the supervision of Dr. Jack Hurley (Professor Emeritus of History at the University of Memphis). While working at Weaver and Associates from 2001-2003, I worked as an archaeology lab and field technician where I worked on several historic and prehistoric archaeological surveys, including the Phase III survey of the Memphis Arena (FedEx Forum) in 2001-2002 in downtown Memphis, the Cobblestone Landing project in 2001 in downtown Memphis, and Wayne Furnace (40WY87) in 2002. After graduation I completed an archaeological field school of a historic farmstead (40SY1) on the property of Chucalissa Indian Museum in Memphis, Tennessee. Dr. Ellen Shlasko, historic archaeologist and former University of Memphis professor, supervised the field school.

While attending graduate school History at North Carolina State University (NCSU) in Raleigh, North Carolina, I had two internships under the supervision of Dr. David Zonderman. The first internship was at a historic park, Historic Oak View County Park, where I administered educational programming to school groups and the public on North Carolina history and 19th century farm life. In 2005, I interned for a local real estate developer, Empire Properties, LLC, that focused on preserving Raleigh's downtown commercial buildings. My duties while interning focused on collecting, cataloguing, and archiving a large collection of materials from a late 19th century African American Grand United Order of the Odd Fellows (GUOOF) Building that had original materials related to the Raleigh, North Carolina Chapter of GUOOF and the women's auxiliary, the Household of Ruth. These materials included personal letters, ritual handbook, alters, regalia, and even human remains.

After completing my M.A. in Public History at NCSU, I volunteered as a research assistant for Catherine W. Bishir in 2005-2006 for the research documentation compiled during the creation of *North Carolina Architects and Builders* (https://ncarchitects.lib.ncsu.edu/). During my time as her research assistant, I authored and co-authored fifteen entries in the on-line publication (see *On-Line Publications*).

From 2006-2007, I worked as an architectural historian for Ruth Little at Longleaf Historic Resources, LLC to assist in conducting an architectural survey for the North Carolina State Historic Preservation Office (NC-SHPO) to update Wake County's Historic Building survey for all buildings built 1945-1965, also referred to as the postwar resources. This survey included photographing and completing survey forms on 44,000 historic resources.

My experience as an architectural historian for Panamerican Consultants, Inc. (Panamerican) began by being awarded a bid from the Arkansas Historic Preservation Program's (AHPP) Main Street Program on a National Register nomination project for Waldron Commercial Historic District in Scott County, Arkansas in February 2008, which was officially listed in the National Register in September 25, 2008. The AHPP Main Street Program receives Certified Local Government (CLG) funds for their surveys and nominations. Additionally, in 2008 I assisted two other architectural historians, Kelly Nolte and Stacey Griffin, with a Historic American Building Survey (HABS) at Fort Benning in Georgia and a large-scale survey of a military installation of all resources over 50 years old at Dugway Proving Ground in Utah. At the end of 2008, I conducted the survey and nomination form for the Mena Commercial Historic District in Polk County, Arkansas for the AHPP, which was officially listed on the National Register July 23, 2009.

Sherwood Mine Company (Sherwood, Tennessee) hired Panamerican in 2008 to conduct a cultural resources survey for a deteriorated early 20th century mining facility with elaborate Egyptian and Gothic Revival architecture known as the "Castle in the Hollow" where I completed an NRHP evaluation of the standing structures. I gave a tour of the structures in late 2008 for the Society of Industrial Historians.

In early 2009, I conducted an NRHP evaluation, including extensive archival research, on a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) project in Rolling Fork, Sharkey County, Mississippi for Site 38, Rolling Fork Mounds/Graft Dairy Farm (22H506) for an iconic early 20th century dairy barn and kit silo. I also surveyed and wrote the nominations for another AHPP project that included three National Register nominations (Lepanto Commercial Historic District [NR Listed 9/21/2009], Marked Tree Commercial Historic District [NR Listed 9/18/2009], and Harrisburg Commercial Historic District [NR Listed 9/18/2009]) located in Poinsett County, Arkansas.

I began working on Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) Section 106 projects in 2009. The first project was for the proposed Byhalia Road Widening Project in Collierville, Shelby County, Tennessee where I acted as architectural historian and sole author. This project resulted in a finding of adverse effect to the John M. Fleming Home Place (NR Listed 1990) and required Section 4(f) involvement that resulted in a "de minimis impact" finding. I acted as architectural historian and sole author on several other TDOT architectural/historical assessments for civil engineering firms from 2009 to 2010. These included Bunker Hill Road (Giles County, Tennessee) and Holmes Road (Shelby County, Tennessee), Milton Wilson Road (Shelby County, Tennessee), and New Canada Road (Shelby County, Tennessee).

In 2009, I worked on two archaeological projects (Phase III for Jacksonport State Park [3JA53] and Phase I for the Ouachita Joint Pipeline in Union County, Arkansas) as the Staff Historian conducting archival research and chain of title searches for land deeds. Additionally, I was architectural historian on a Georgia Port Authority project for a mid-20th century wharf located on the East River Terminal in Brunswick, Georgia where extensive research was conducted on the history of the terminal and a survey of the wharf where I chartered a boat to take me underneath the wharf to investigate the truncated pilings from the 19th century. By 2009, I began develop proposals/work plans and cost estimates, as well as, writing statement of qualifications for RFQs, for all architectural history projects for the Memphis office.

In 2010, I conducted another AHPP-awarded National Register nomination for the Conway Commercial Historic District in Faulkner County, Arkansas, which was officially listed on the NRHP in September 2010. Between 2009 and 2010, I directed the fieldwork and sole authored 24 cell tower projects where I acted as both the staff archaeologist and architectural historian. I completed FCC Form 620's for eight of the cell tower sites in Miami, Florida and wrote combined cultural resources reports for the cell tower sites located throughout Tennessee. Additionally, I conducted a desktop study and mapped the archaeological sites for over 800 miles of transmission line through Arkansas and Oklahoma for Southwestern Power Administration. I concluded 2010 with a Section 106 survey for the Jackson Avenue Ramp Project in Knoxville, Tennessee, a c. 1920 deteriorated brick and concrete ramp within a historic district that required recommendations for the mitigating the adverse effect finding.

During 2011, I worked on several Mississippi Department of Transportation road improvement projects conducting Section 106 studies including SR-25/US 278 Amory Bypass in Monroe County, Mississippi (2012); SR 15 from County Road 312 in Tippah County, Mississippi (2011); and 17.1 Mi. I-55 Improvements in Hinds County, Mississippi. Other work included a NRHP evaluation of a c. 1910 railroad trestle on the Arkansas River near downtown Little Rock. During a survey for the Tennessee Valley Authority for the proposed Walton Cove Development along the Tennessee River in Tishomingo County, Mississippi, Andrew Saatkamp and I discovered an unrecovered rifle trench and two-gun battery in 2011 that was previously unrecorded by the Mississippi Department of Archives and History (MDAH). I recommended the Civil War earthwork eligible for listing in the NRHP under Criterion A and C after finding information showing it was related to a small skirmish near Eastport, Mississippi.

In 2012, I assisted Kelly Nolte on a survey to document historic resources within the Rahway River in Rahway, New Jersey for USACE (New York District). Later that year, I directed a large project

for Main Street Memphis for sidewalk improvements and a greenline that included several historic districts to determine if any contributing resources, features or objects would be impacted. The report produced made recommendations on certain features and granite curbing that needed to be avoided that were in commercial historic districts along Main Street in downtown Memphis. Another interesting survey that year was for the Shelby County government involving 4.3 miles of an abandoned railroad grade, c. 1889 railroad trestle and c. 1889 Cordova Train Station once part of the Midland Railway Line along the proposed Shelby Farms Greenline near Cordova, Tennessee.

In 2013, I directed a Historic American Engineering Record (HAER) for the NRHP eligible c. 1920 Little Tallahatchie Bridge at Highway 7 in Lafayette County, Mississippi that was submitted to the Mississippi Department of Transportation. I also conducted a Section 106 survey for the Tuscaloosa office for the Cypress Creek Restoration project in downtown Montgomery, Alabama. Throughout the year, I completed 15 cell tower surveys throughout Tennessee and Mississippi.

During 2014, I completed over 40 cell tower surveys within Tennessee. In 2014, the TN-SHPO changed their policy and began to require separate Section 106 reports for archaeology and architectural history instead of a combined cultural resources report. In the summer of 2014, I conducted archival research and photo documented the WPA Cameron Bluff Amphitheater at Mount Magazine as part of an Arkansas Parks restoration project with C. Andrew Buchner. Prior to my departure from Panamerican in the summer of 2014, I completed the fieldwork and draft for the National Register Nomination and survey of the Civilian Corps (CCC) Shady Lake Campground in Scott County, Arkansas. Additionally, I spearheaded a project for the Southwestern Power Administration (SWPA) to amend their Multi-State Cultural Resources Programmatic Agreement working closely with the OK-SHPO, MO-SHPO, AR-SHPO, ACHP, and various THPOs.

Between 2010 and 2014, I sketched maps of cemeteries and conducted archival research and oral histories on several cemetery projects for various clients while teamed up with C. Andrew Buchner and Chester Walker, who conducted the archaeological and geophysical side of the survey. These cemetery projects included: Pleasant Grove (PawPaw) Cemetery in Quitman County, Mississippi (2011); Two Cemeteries near Sidon, Leflore County, Mississippi (2011); Stout Cemetery near Highway 7, South of Dover, Pope County, Arkansas (2013); Goforth Cemetery on US Highway 167, Independence County, Arkansas (2013); and Unmarked Graves at Unity Baptist Church on Highway 82, Ashley County, Arkansas (2014).

Between 2008 and 2014, I conducted numerous projects on Phase I surveys and conducted combined cultural resource surveys for various clients as both staff archaeologists and architectural historian, many of which were cell tower sites, well pads for natural gas pipelines, or road projects.

Between 2014 to 2021, I worked for Caldwell Compliance, a consulting company specializing in regulatory compliance for telecommunications companies. From 2014-2020, I co-lead a team of 15-20 people managing preconstruction and postconstruction compliance for AT&T's Northern California market (2014-2020). This work included tracking, managing, reviewing, and ordering and submitting NEPA-related documents to AT&T's National Network Compliance team for either construction notice-to-proceed or on-air notice to proceed. I also administered training to clients and the Caldwell team on NEPA and Section 106 regulations to ensure projects were compliant with the FCC's National Programmatic Agreement (NPA). I developed the Section 106 mapping/prescreening process for DAS/small cell technology for several clients and drafted the template for Collocation Exemption letters (CELs) used at Caldwell for projects that meet the Section 106 exemptions in the NPA. Additionally, I developed the process for post construction RF Safety Audit Packages for FCC signage/barriers requirements. During this time, I reviewed and submitted documents for thousands of new cell tower builds and collocations.

In 2020, I began a new project where I acted as Regulatory Compliance Manager for Ericsson in the New England market tracking, managing, and submitting documents for post construction projects to AT&T's National team for compliance on-air notice to proceed, as well as having to attend meetings several times a week to update the client on priority projects. I also developed the in-house process for submitting and tracking projects in Caldwell's internal database.

In 2021, I moved from the Ericsson project to be a National Program Manager for the West Region for Dish Wireless where I managed and tracked compliance for proposed telecommunications builds for 11 markets (including Los Angeles and San Francisco) in the West Region for an entirely new network being deployed. All four of us National Program Managers managed a team of anywhere from 15-25 regulatory compliance analysts. Our projections were to complete construction notice to proceed for over 30,000 builds within two years. I spearheaded the in-house and client training for all non-tower (i.e., buildings, transmission towers, water tanks, etc.) builds for FCC, FAA, NEPA/Section 106, Phase I/Hazardous materials, and RF Safety review processes. I drafted the regulatory policy for RF Safety reporting for Dish National Headquarters (HQ). I developed relationships with environmental and electromagnetic energy (EME) vendors on POR process and reporting, as well as negotiating pricing for various types of documentation. I reviewed projects to determine regulatory documentation required for FCC compliance. I ordered this documentation from various environmental vendors, reviewed/approved uploaded documentation, and managed/tracked projects in the Dish database. Additionally, I managed, tracked, and ordered jurisdictional reporting required in the San Francisco market related to regulatory.

From 2017 to 2021, I became an independent consultant conducting Section 106 surveys with most of the work being subcontracted with Terracon and Panamerican. Although Terracon Consultants, Inc. had an in-house architectural historian, they hired my services on select cell tower projects in Tennessee and Arkansas during 2017-2018 that had NRHP eligible or listed properties, since I had a proven track record of assisting them with mitigation plans to either stealth or modify the tower to resolve any adverse effect findings.

I subcontracted with Panamerican on numerous TDOT projects for civil engineering firms where I wrote the work plan, cost schedule, and coordinated with the client. These projects included: Widening of Shelby Drive (US 57) to U.S. Highway 72 in Shelby County, Tennessee (2017); STP Memphis Airport, Plough Boulevard, Memphis, Tennessee (2019); North Parkway Sidewalk Project, Memphis, Tennessee (2020); East Holmes Road Widening, Shelby County, Tennessee (2021); and Audubon Park Channel Replacement, Memphis, Tennessee (2020-2022). Audubon Park Channel Replacement resulted in a Finding of Adverse Effect and Section 4(f) involvement after determining that the 330-acre Audubon Park was NRHP eligible and the c. 1950 channel being replaced was a contributing feature to the park. After consultation with TDOT Historic Preservation and the TN-SHPO, a mitigation plan to have a NR nomination form completed for Audubon Park was agreed upon and Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) was drafted. After I completed the nomination form in early 2022, Audubon Park Historic District was officially listed on the National Register November 2022.

In 2020 and 2021, I conducted architectural/historical assessments on two projects for USACE (Memphis District) surveying the floodwalls in Caruthersville, Missouri and in Helena, Arkansas. Both projects included intensive surveys of the floodwalls and surrounding structures and extensive archival research. Both projects resulted in Finding of Adverse Effects due to the floodwalls both being eligible for NRHP listing under Criterion A and C; however, mitigation plans have not yet been developed by USACE and SHPO. Additionally, I completed Section 106 reviews for two Illinois Central Railroad bridges (2020) and an NRHP evaluation of an electric substation in Van Buren, Arkansas (2020) under subcontract with Panamerican.

In January 2022, I resigned from Caldwell and established Clifton Historic Resources, LLC to solely focus on working as an architectural historian. I continued to develop my own proposals

and budgets/cost estimates to bid on work. I completed six TDOT projects during 2022-2023, which included the Holmes Road Widening Project near Mill Branch Road, Memphis, Tennessee (2022); Jefferson Avenue Cycle Track, Memphis, Tennessee (2022); Poplar Avenue Improvement Project, Memphis, Tennessee (2022); Macon-Mullins Station Road Pedestrian Improvement Project, Memphis, Tennessee (2022); Bellwood Hollow Road Improvements, Stewart County, Tennessee (2022); and Memphis Cobblestones Landing Restoration and Improvement Project (2022).

Poplar Avenue Improvement Project (2022) and Jefferson Avenue Cycle Track (2022) projects both had no adverse effect findings but had nearly 2 miles of corridor in and around downtown Memphis with a high volume of historic resources. Macon-Mullins Station Road Pedestrian Improvements (2022) had a no adverse effect finding, but the project required land to be acquired from an NRHP eligible property resulting in a "de minimis impact" on a Section 4(f) resource.

C. Andrew Buchner and I jointly conducted a cultural resources study for the Bellwood Hollow Road Improvements (2022). The project involved a complete inventory of structures within the visual APE, which included the NR Listed Bellwood Furnace (40SW210) that included the c. 1840 Iron Master's House and Bellwood Furnace Stack. The intensive archival research that I conducted involved a 17-page chain of title related to the land acquisitions from the Cumberland Iron Works after its establishment in Stewart County, Tennessee in 1829.

Additionally, I was subcontracted and completed the historic context chapter for the architectural/historical assessment of the Architectural/Historical Assessment of NASA Marshall Space Flight Center directed by Stacey Griffin. The historic context included the people, events, programs, and technologies involved and contribute to placing the MSFC's history within a broader context in its over 70-year history since its establishment as an Army Chemical Shell production facility to present day. This was followed by a 20-page list of milestone timeline of its most important events.

In 2023, I have completed a Section 106 study for the Paul R. Lowry Road Extension in Memphis, Tennessee that resulted in a no adverse effect finding followed by a Section 106 study for the City of Milan for the land transfer of 292 acres from the Milan Army Ammunitions Plant in Gibson County, Tennessee. Currently, I am writing a historic context and NRHP evaluation for a d. 1894 brick arched storm drain in downtown Memphis for the City of Memphis subcontracted under Commonwealth Heritage Group (formerly Panamerican). Thus far, I have completed the photo documentation of the underground storm drain and intensive archival research. The storm drain is a direct result of the aftermath of the yellow fever epidemic of 1878 in Memphis that resulting in the forming of the Taxing District of Shelby County and disbandment of the Memphis charter in 1879 in an effort to make infrastructure improvement to the city and initiate a sanitation movement.

In 2024, my work has focused more on local government work conducting survey work to update old survey records. I have completed two large scale surveys that included the Columbia Historic Inventory (504 properties) and Hillcrest Neighborhood (379 properties) where survey forms and a survey report were completed, as well as a National Register Nomination for a commercial historic district in Arkansas. I am currently working on the National Register Nomination for national significance for a Rosenwald funded school called Paul Laurence Dunbar Junior and Senior High School and Junior College in Little Rock, Arkansas. I have continued to conduct SHPO reviews on telecommunications projects for various new tower builds and collocations throughout the year.
